Statements

- In English a statement is a complete thought
- In Python a statement is a complete instructions
 - **A statement does something**
 - print "Hello World"
 - x = 20;

Coming up: Expressions

Expressions

- Expressions don't do anything, they are something

– **Expressions are something**

- "Hello"
- $(a < b)$
- 26
- $100 - (25 * 2)$

Assuming $a=10$ and $b=5$, this expression is something.. what?

Coming up: Statements contain expressions

Statements contain expressions

- print "Hello"

Expression

Statement

- if $(x < 10)$ or $(y \neq 200)$:
print "Oops"

Coming up: Expression or statement

Expression or statement

print 23+98

Statement

“The world” + “is flat”

Expression

x = “The world” + “is flat”

Statement

(score == 90) or not (score < 22)
